

## Clyde branch outing to Musselburgh

11<sup>th</sup> November 2023 (1100-1500)

Weather: Fine, clear, sunny and calm.

26 of us met at the small car park next to the boating pond at Musselburgh. We were very fortunate that it turned out to be a lovely day after recent weekends of severe storms. For six people (including two from Fife), it was their first Clyde SOC outing.

We made our way over to the sea wall and very quickly notched up **Red-breasted Mergansers**, both **Great Crested** and **Slavonian Grebes**, **Razorbill** and **Eiders**. A lovely group of **Long-tailed Duck**, four very smart males and a female gave us a good showing and were much admired by the group. Somewhat further out a group of drake **Velvet Scoters** were new species for some of the group, but their numbers were short of the hundreds or thousands present in recent winters.

We proceeded along the busy walkway to the new lagoon at the west end of the site and from the rather uncomfortable concrete-built hides and had good views of the roosting waders at high water, mostly **Oystercatchers** but smaller numbers of **Bar-tailed Godwits**, **Grey Plover** and **Ringed Plovers**. A few pairs of **Gadwall** and **Shoveler** were also new for the day list. A mixed flock of **Linnets** with quite a few **Twites** gave distant views through the telescopes.

It was then a walk back to the cars to take a late lunch seeing a pair of **Stonechats** on the inland fence line before visiting the scrapes where we had great views of feeding and roosting waders and ducks, including **Curlew**, **Lapwing**, **Dunlin**, **Snipe**, **Wigeon**, **Teal** and **Shelduck**. The local Sparrowhawk stirred up the birds and appeared right above our heads before being chased off by a crow.

A very respectable 62 species of birds was recorded including three new to the Outings list (**Long-tailed Duck**, **Grey Plover** and **Twite**) bringing that list up to 162 species since we resumed outings after Lockdown.
