

## **Clyde branch outing to Newshot Island**

22<sup>nd</sup> July 2023 (1000-1430)

17 people assembled on a damp, grey Saturday morning at the riverside carpark at Kilpatrick Drive, Erskine for the SOC outing to Newshot Island. Most of the attendees were not part of the group at this walk last year, and a few had not been to this area before. For two people, it was their first Clyde SOC branch outing. After Allan and Zul gave an introduction, the group headed to the Clyde walkway at Park Quay.

The first birds of the day included a small flock of **Long-tailed Tits** which quickly moved through the carpark, seen only by the earliest group members! From Park Quay the group scanned the Clyde and picked up various birds, including a **Common Tern** plus **Lesser Black-backed**, **Common** and **Blackheaded Gulls**, **Mallards**, **Oystercatchers**, **Common Sandpiper**, **Woodpigeons**, **Magpies** and **Carrion Crows**. A scan of the gulls at the Dalmuir sewage outfall failed to turn up a hoped-for Mediterranean Gull so the group then headed along the path to scan the mouth of the creek at Newshot Island.

A **Grey Wagtail** was flushed out from the riverbank here. The group then picked up a flock of up to 20 **Swifts** over the nearby housing estate.

The tide was out at Newshot Island so the group did not pick up much more than more gulls. The group then made the short walk to the viewpoint at Newshot Island. On the way we had a look at some of the flora on site as well, which included plenty of **Broad-leaved Helleborines** and some faded **Common Spotted Orchids**.

From the viewpoint 3 **Goosanders** plus **Curlew**, **Lapwing** and **Redshank** were added to the day's sightings. A **Great Spotted Woodpecker** was also heard calling unseen from the nearby trees. While the group was watching the river, the Waverley paddle steamer went past which caused most of the birds on-site to take flight.

The plan next was to go through the neighbouring housing estate and cross over the gate at Hawthorn Avenue. On the way the group got sightings of 3 Whitethroats plus Blackcap, Blue Tit, Goldfinch and more of the Swifts.

While going trough the housing estate we picked up a few **House Martins** feeding overhead, part of a small colony which breeds here.

After climbing over the gate into the field, the group checked the hedgerow and the edge of the reedbed. We heard a couple of **Water Rails** giving their squealing calls from inside the reeds. There were also sightings of **Reed Bunting**, **Greenfinch** and **Willow Warbler**, with at least five of the latter seen.

The group headed along the field to view the lagoon and the back of the creek. From here we quickly picked up some good sightings, including a surprise in the form of a **Hooded Crow**, 1 **Greenshank**, 3 **Redshanks**, 4 **Common Sandpipers**, 1 **Moorhen**, 23 **Teal**, another **Curlew** plus **Mallards**, **Starlings** and **House Martins**. A **Water Rail** was also seen briefly by a couple of group members.

After having lunch in the field, the group headed back to the LNR and Park Quay. A last check of the river turned up an increase to 4 **Common Terns** plus 1 **Great Black-backed Gull** and 3 **Common Sandpipers** among the other birds seen. From there the group made their way back to the carpark and said their goodbyes.

47 species were recorded including Common Tern which was new to the outings list (bringing it up to 155 species). Thank you to everyone who attended, it was very nice to show a group around my local patch and I'm hoping for more people to visit this under-watched but rewarding area!
